### Trinity Sunday & The Martyrs Picture

The picture on the front of the Newsletter shows the Blessed Trinity at the top of the painting - with two English martyrs, St Thomas of Canterbury & St Edmund, below. It is known as "The Martyrs Picture" & is in the chapel of the Venerable English College in Rome. It was painted in 1581 by Durante Alberti – just before St Ralph Sherwin was martyred at Tyburn on December 1 1581 – together with St Edmund Campion and St Alexander Bryant.

**Baptism is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation** in the Catholic Church – the other two being First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

## ST JUSTIN MARTYR (100-165 AD)

### Feast Day Tuesday 1 June

**Born c 100AD Justin was the son of Greek speaking pagans.** He studied Philosophy & admired Christians for their moral lives. He was baptized c. 30AD & moved to Rome.

He then wrote apologetic works which argued for the Catholic faith against the claims of Jews, pagans, and non-Christians. Several of these works were written to Roman officials, to refute lies told about the Church. His two most famous apologetical treatises were "Apologies" and "Dialogue with Tryphon."

**In these books, he gave clear descriptions of the early Church's beliefs and liturgy. In modern times, scholars have noted that Justin's descriptions correspond to the traditions of the Catholic Church on every essential point.**

He describes the weekly Sunday liturgy as a sacrifice, and speaks of the Eucharist as the true body and blood of Christ. He further states that only baptized persons who believe the Church's teachings, and are free of serious sin, may receive it. Justin also explains that the Church regards celibacy as a sacred calling & condemns the common practice of killing infants. Refusing to offer sacrifice to pagan gods, St Justin was martyred in 165AD.
